
North Carolina's Participation in World War I

Charlie Knight is Curator of Military History at the North Carolina Museum of History in Raleigh. He has 20 years of experience in the museum field, having previously worked as a Historical Interpreter at New Market Battlefield Park in New Market, VA; Curator at the Douglas MacArthur Memorial in Norfolk, VA; and Director of the Arizona Capitol Museum in Phoenix, AZ. He joined the North Carolina Museum of History staff in 2017. Charlie is excited to speak about the participation of North Carolina troops in the war to end all wars.

Charlie Knight is a graduate of Bridgewater College and American Military University, with degrees in U. S. History and Military History. He has written numerous articles and book reviews for a variety of magazines, including *Blue & Gray, Classic Trains, Hallowed Ground,* among others. His first book, *Valley Thunder: The Battle of New Market,* was published in 2010, and his second book, *Robert E. Lee: Day by Day,* will be published in 2019; he is also working on a biography of Confederate General and railroad magnate William Mahone. Charlie has spoken to various historical organizations and at conferences around the country, and was an advisor to the 2014 film *Field of Lost Shoes*, about the Battle of New Market.
